A quick reference for Parents & Carers

What to do if...	Action Needed	Return to the academy/F2E when...
My child has Covid-19 symptoms: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • High Temperature This means feeling hot to touch on your child's chest or back. • A New Continuous Cough This means coughing a lot more than an hour or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24hours. • A loss or change to your child's sense of smell or taste. This means your child has noticed that they cannot smell or taste anything or that things taste differently from normal. 	<p>DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO BRADFIELDS or F2E DO NOT PUT YOUR CHILD ON SCHOOL TRANSPORT</p> <p>Contact the academy or F2E immediately to inform us. Get a test for your child and anyone else showing symptoms within your household. Book your test here: www.nhs.uk/coronavirus or call 119 Self-isolate the whole household while you wait for the test results. If the result is positive continue to isolate for a total of 14 days.</p> <p>INFORM the ACADEMY/F2E immediately about the TEST RESULT</p>	...The test comes back negative and your child is well.
My child tests positive for Covid-19...	<p>DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO BRADFIELDS or F2E DO NOT PUT YOUR CHILD ON SCHOOL TRANSPORT</p> <p>Contact the academy or F2E immediately to inform us. Agree an earliest date for possible return with the academy/F2E. Minimum of 10 days, if temperature has gone. Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days. Your child's Class, Year group or Community will also isolate for 14 days and remote learning will begin.</p>	...They feel better. They can return after 10 days if they have not had a temperature for at least 48hours before their return. Symptoms of cough or loss of taste/smell can last for several weeks.
My child tests negative...	<p>Contact the academy or F2E immediately to inform us. Discuss with the academy/F2E when your child can come back (same day/next day).</p>	...The test comes back negative and you have contacted the academy/F2E
My child is ill with symptoms not linked to covid-19	Follow the usual absence procedures to report your child's illness and keep them at home until they are well enough to return.	..When they are well.
Someone in my household has Covid-19 symptoms	<p>DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO BRADFIELDS or F2E Contact the academy or F2E immediately to inform us. Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days. Ensure the household member gets tested and report the results to the academy. INFORM the ACADEMY/F2E immediately about the TEST RESULT</p>	...The test comes back negative and you have contacted the academy/F2E.
Someone in my household tests positive for Covid-19	<p>DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO BRADFIELDS or F2E Contact the academy or F2E immediately to inform us. Agree an earliest date for possible return with the academy/F2E. Minimum of 10 days, if temperature has gone. Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days.</p>	...Your child has completed 14 days of isolation and no longer has a temperature.
NHS test and trace has identified my child has been in close contact with someone with symptoms of confirmed Covid-19	<p>DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO BRADFIELDS or F2E Contact the academy or F2E immediately to inform us. Agree an earliest date for possible return with the academy/F2E. Minimum of 14 days.</p>	...Your child has completed 14 days of isolation and no longer has a temperature. They

	Your child must isolate during this period.	must not have had temperature for at least 48hours before their return.
Where your child has travelled abroad and has to self-isolate as a period of quarantine.	Where possible avoid taking holidays in term time, if a holiday in term time is necessary ensure you have written to the academy/F2E to request the leave and inform us of where you are going. Consider the quarantine requirements and Foreign & Commonwealth Office (CFO) advice when booking travel. Returning from a destination where quarantine is needed. Agree an earliest date for possible return with the academy/F2E. Minimum of 14 days from return date. All who have travelled should isolate.	...The quarantine period of 14 days has been completed.
We have received medical advice from a specialist that my child must resume shielding.	DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO BRADFIELDS or F2E Contact the academy or F2E immediately to inform us and provide a copy of the letter from the medical specialist. Shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted and that your shielding is paused again. Support your child in accessing remote education from home.	...Confirm with the academy or F2E that restrictions have been lifted again and your child can return to the academy/F2E.
I have heard that there is a student/intern or staff member who has suspected symptoms of Covid-19 in the academy / F2E.	It is ok to send your child to Bradfields or F2E The academy/F2E will keep you updated. There is no need to isolate until we have the results of the test.	...Your child can continue to attend the academy/F2E.
My child's Class/Key Stage /Community is closed due to a confirmed Covid-19 case in the academy / F2E.	DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO BRADFIELDS or F2E DO NOT PUT YOUR CHILD ON SCHOOL TRANSPORT You will need to follow the guidance of the academy/F2E. Your child will need to isolate for 14 days . If during this period they then begin to show symptoms, please inform the academy/F2E immediately. They should then get tested and continue to isolate until they get the results. INFORM the ACADEMY/F2E immediately about the TEST RESULT. Support your child in accessing remote education from home.	...The academy/F2E will inform you when their class/Key Stage/Community will be reopened and your child can return.
What is isolation?	Self-isolation is when you are told to stay at home for a set period of time. When isolating: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do not leave your home for any reason. • Do not have visitors in your home. • Try to avoid contact with members of your household as much as possible. Isolation does not mean that you are on holiday. To keep everyone safe you must follow the guidelines.	... Once your isolation period has been completed and you do not have a temperature you and your family can return to your normal routines.
