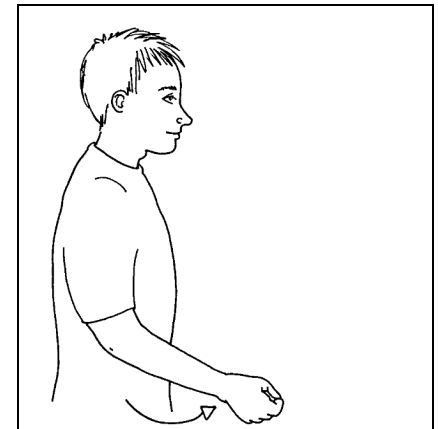

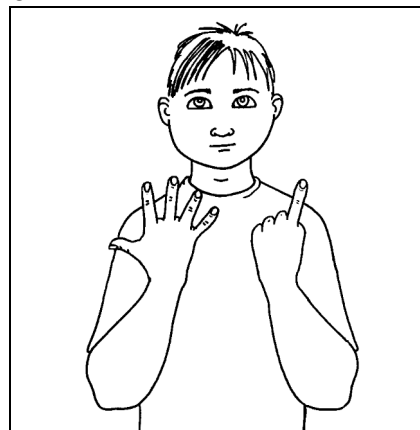

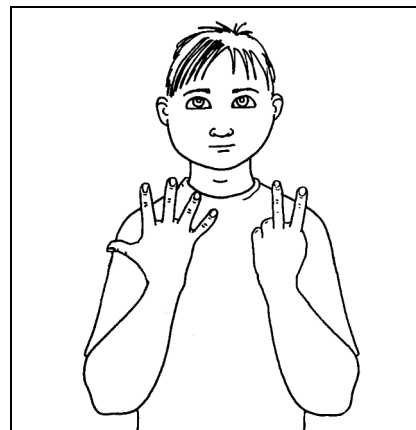
Working flat hand (palm in, pointing forward) wiggles forwards like a fish swimming.

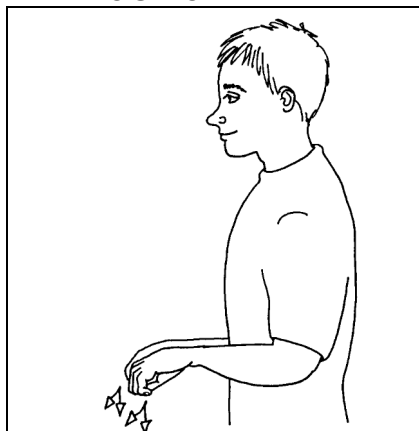

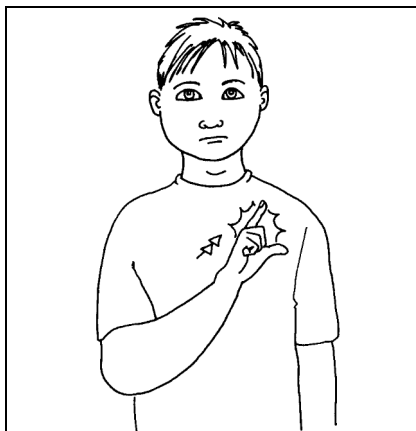

LET IT GO AGAIN



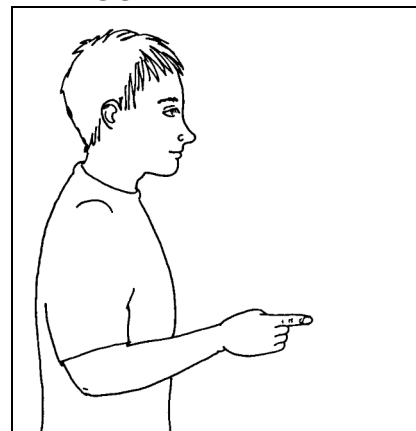
Full "O" hands (palms down, pointing forward) make short movement down and apart while changing to open hands.

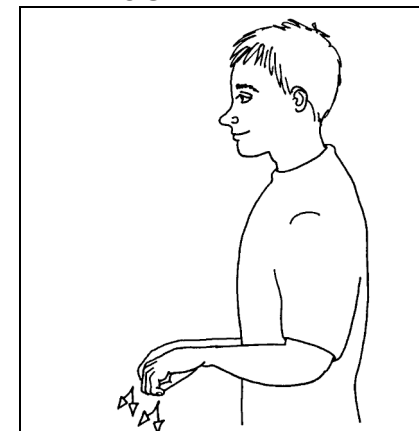
Side of working hand with extended index and thumb taps against supporting side of upper chest twice.

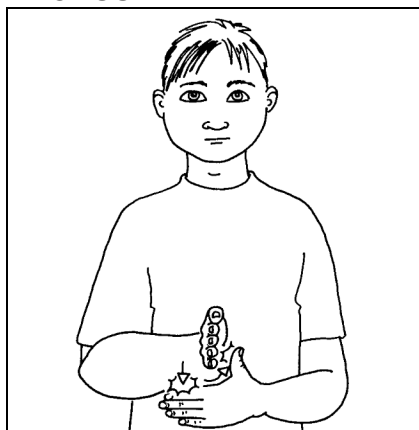
Working index hand (palm in, pointing forward) indicates person.

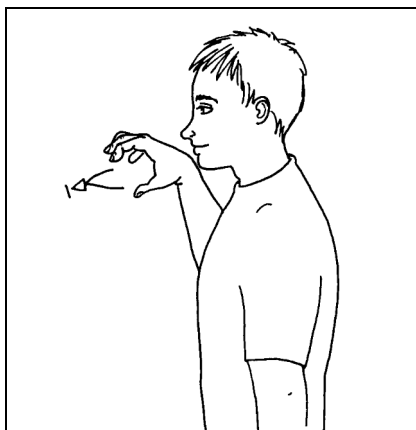
Full "O" hands (palms down, pointing forward) make short movement down and apart while changing to open hands.

BECAUSE



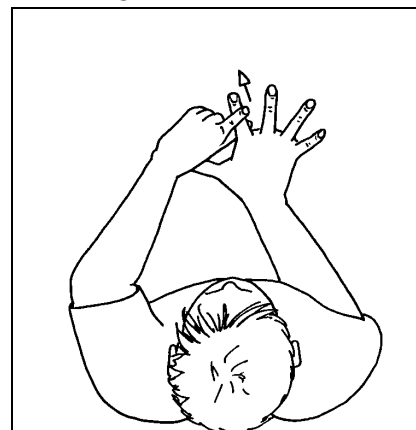

IT BIT



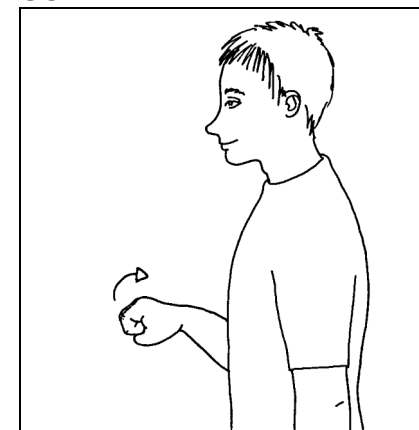
Working clawed hand (palm forward/down, pointing forward/up) moves forward from mouth closing sharply to bunched hand.

MY FINGER



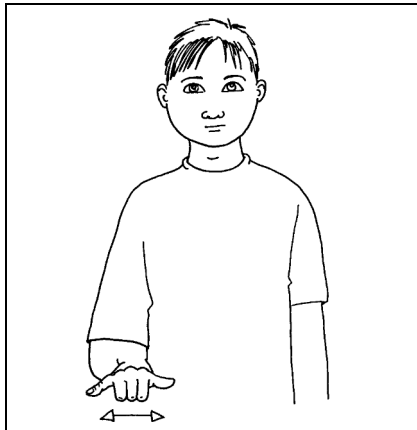
Supporting open hand (palm down, pointing forward); working open hand (palm up) pinched and moved along each finger.

Working fist (palm down, pointing forward) bends to point up.

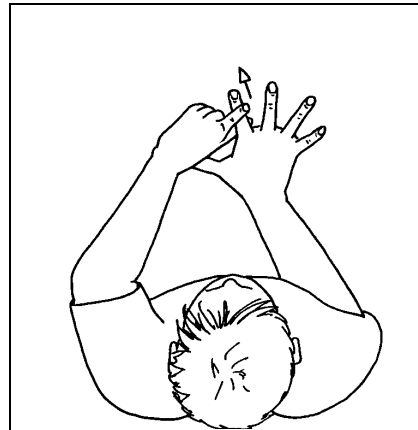
WHICH



Working "Y" hand (palm down, pointing forward) moves slightly from side to side.

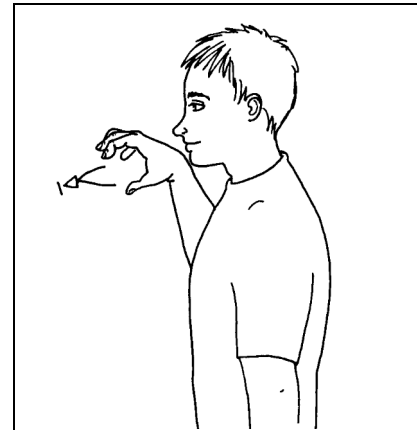
Directional sign.

FINGER



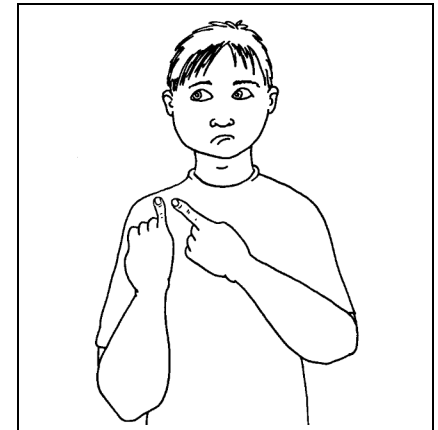
Supporting open hand (palm down, pointing forward); working open pinched hand moves along each finger.

THIS LITTLE FINGER ON THE RIGHT



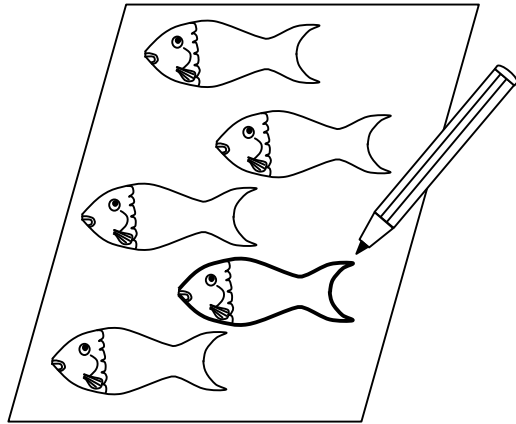
Hold up little finger (palm back, pointing up) point to it with left hand.

Use appropriate facial expression.

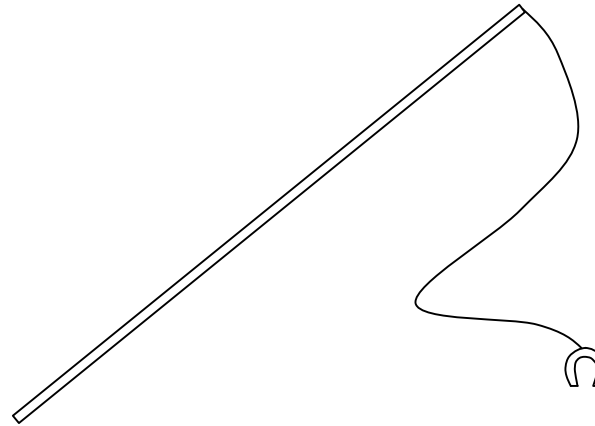
Make your own fishing game for 1, 2, 3, 4, 5

Make your own Fishing Game

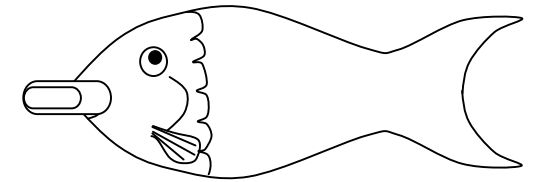
You will need: five bamboo garden sticks, each about $\frac{1}{2}$ meter long; a ball of string; paperclips; five horseshoe magnets (available from large toyshops); paper or thin card.



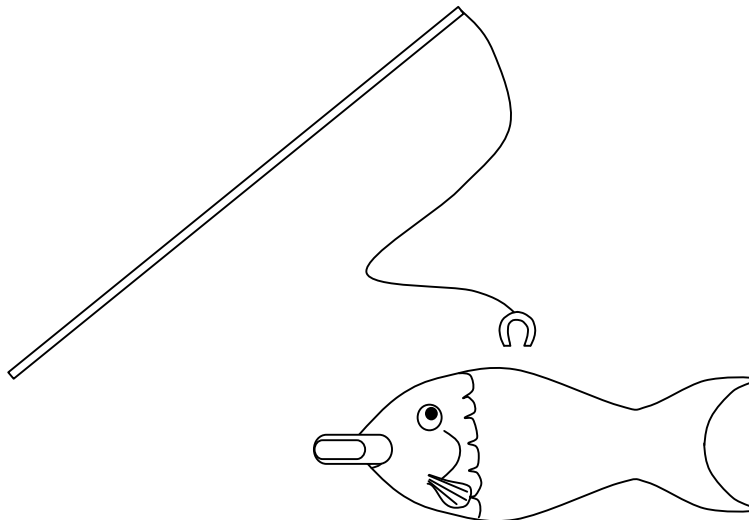
1 Use the fish template, overleaf, to draw around and cut out five fish, you can colour them in if you wish.



2 Attach a piece of string to each of the garden sticks and then tie the magnets to the string.

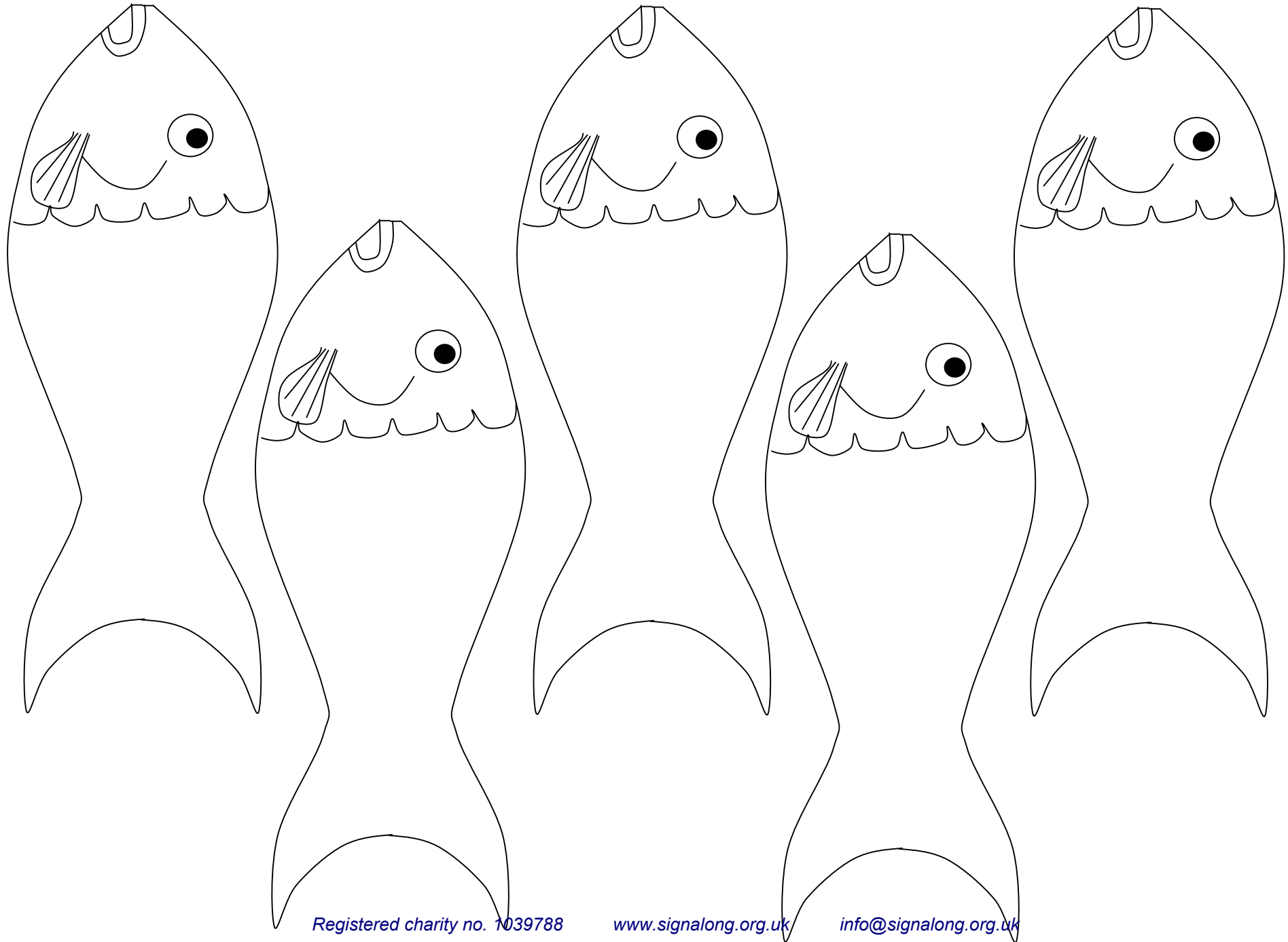


3 Push a paper clip onto the mouth of each of the five fishes.



4 Lay the fish on the floor and see if you can catch all five.
